Hardware Requirements

To participate campers/students will need:

- A computer Mac or PC (please check individual camp requirements,)
- · A web cam and microphone
- A high-speed Internet Connection

Please note that Chromebooks, Ipads and Tablets are unable to install and run most of the software we use in the programs.

Zoom Meeting Software

All virtual programs are held in Zoom Meeting Rooms. Each camper/student will receive an Access Link prior to the start of the camp or program. This Link will be sent out one or two days before the start of the program.

Check it out ahead of time. Zoom let's you adjust the audio and webcam settings to achieve the best experience!

Culture of Respect

We want every participant to get the most out of each program. To make that happen please follow these simple quidelines:

- Be respectful and kind to other participants and to instructors.
- Ensure that your webcam and microphone are setup and working properly so that campers can participate fully.

Making the Most of a Virtual Learning Opportunity

Is your child ready for a virtual program?

Learning online is different than learning in-person. Young children ages 6-10, and those that are new-to-online learning often need support getting started.

Parents: Prior to the Virtual Class there are things to set up

Software Installation: Some classes require that software be installed ahead of class time. We provide installation instructions for programs that require third-party software. These include programs such as Minecraft and Gamemaker. Need help? Please reach out to the instructor.

Account Set Up: Some programs require or recommend that an account is set up. An example of this is Scratch. An account will allow your child to save their work and share their projects.

Parents: Helping Your Child on the first day of class

Be available to your child at the start of the first class. What type of skills should they have or can they acquire?

Essential Skills:

- Comfortable using a computer
- O How to join a Zoom classroom
- O How to turn their microphone on or off
- o How to turn their video on or off

Social Skills:

- Comfortable asking for help in a virtual classroom if needed
- Who to ask for help at home if they get disconnected or otherwise need help!

Computer Skills:

- Be able to type their name
- How to open a program, for example Minecraft (if necessary)
- How to log in to a program, for example, Scratch (if necessary)
- How to switch between the Zoom classroom and other programs
